Facilities

- The Club has 11 tennis courts: 4 porous acrylic, 4 artificial clay and 3 grass courts.
- The 8 porous acrylic and clay courts have floodlights.
- Court 1 has a tennis practice wall.
- Our courtside tennis pavilion provides ladies and gentlemen toilet, shower and changing room facilities and a small kitchen.
- Tea and coffee making facilities and a water dispenser are provided.
- The coaching office is also located in the tennis pavilion.
- The main clubhouse bar is open evenings and weekends.
- There is onsite car parking. However, this can get a little busy if there are simultaneous sports fixtures taking place on the grounds. Traffic for the onsite nursery can be heavy during peak times. You can park in the surrounding streets for up to 2 hours if necessary.
- For cyclists we provide bike racks on site.
- The Club is also served by public transport with bus stops nearby for users.
- We have a tennis ball and tube recycling initiative; the bins can be found near the tennis pavilion.

Tennis Pavilion Entry Fob

To access the pavilion when the door is closed you can purchase an entry fob for £5 which can be collected from James Charman, our Head Pro, or our Facilities team.

The membership fee is an annual subscription payable by the 1st of April each year for the following season. All existing members are automatically invited to renew their membership each year and those who do not renew by 1st April will be removed from the system.



Members joining part way through the season will pay the full membership fee except if joining after 1st October, at which point the fee will be at the pro rata rate shown below:

Membership Refunds

No retrospective refunds of subscriptions will be given. For medical or other reasons considered valid by the Committee your membership may be suspended, and a pro rata refund obtained, by giving notice to the Committee in writing.

All refunds are at the discretion of the Committee.

Court Bookings (MyCourts)

The Club uses the MyCourts system for court bookings, except for the grass courts (usually open May to September) which operate on a 'turn up and play' basis with a manual whiteboard booking system. When you join you will be sent your MyCourts login by email.

Courts can be booked 7 days in advance (Seniors) and 24 hours in advance (Juniors) at no extra cost. Courts 1 to 3 can be booked from 8am until 10pm and courts 4 to 8 until 9pm (except on a Sunday when court 8 can only be booked until 8pm). Singles players can book for one hour, doubles players up to two hours with each player limited to one hourly booking per day.

When booking please ensure every opponent's name is selected and remember to check-in online or on the screen located in the tennis pavilion.

Club social sessions, tournaments, matches, and coaching commitments are already blocked out on the booking system, and the courts are unavailable for personal use at these times. There is no need to book if you wish to attend a Club social session.

Guests

Members are welcome to bring guests onto the courts, accompanied by payment of a guest fee of £5 for an adult and £2.50 for a junior. Each guest can only play up to 3 times in a season. It is your responsibility as a member to ensure any guest fees are paid before you play. All guests' names must be entered on the sheet in the tennis pavilion.

If you are bringing a guest member, please ensure you select the ***Guest opponent option on your MyCourts booking.

Parents wishing to play on court with their children need to purchase either a Family membership or a Senior and Junior membership, depending on which is most cost-effective. We strongly discourage parents either just joining themselves, or just joining their children as juniors, and then using the courts together on a regular basis.

Please help us ensure that everyone pays fairly towards the upkeep and maintenance of our fantastic facilities.

Serving Practice

If you wish to play on your own for serving practice, please ensure you have selected the ***Serving Practice opponent option on your MyCourts booking.

Members **must not** use the courts for these activities Monday to Friday 10am to 12pm and after 6pm, and before 5pm on weekends.





8. Court Usage and Maintenance

Members should satisfy themselves that the courts are suitable for play and that they are safe to play on, particularly when it is raining or frosty.

We invest heavily in the ongoing maintenance of our courts with a rigorous programme of renewal, resurfacing and repainting. To ensure they stay in as good a condition as possible, however, we ask for your help as follows:

- Make the most of any spare time to tidy the courts and clear any loose debris.
- Make the effort to join us for any of the organised leaf sweeping sessions (you'll hear about these via email).
- Do not loosen nets after you have played; they should be left at the correct tension to prolong their life (and the life of the winders).
- Do not bring food or drink onto the courts that could leave a mess. Bins are provided, but if you have recyclable rubbish, please take it with you when you leave.
- Sweep the clay courts after use following the method shown in the information located in the tennis pavilion.
- Contact the Facilities team at maintenance@blackheathlawntennisclub. org.uk or a Committee member if you spot any issues with the facilities or concerns about their use.

The grass courts are normally in use from May to September. Members must adhere to the rules when notices show the grass courts are out of use when too damp or being maintained.

Balls and Floodlights

Tennis balls are provided by the Club for use during Club social sessions and home League matches.

Floodlights are also funded by the Club for use in Club social sessions, coaching sessions, and League matches. A small subset of members has access to the Club payment card for the floodlights for this purpose.


Personal use of the floodlights can be paid for by contactless card payment on the system located in the tennis pavilion. The cost is £4.50 an hour.

Racket Restringing

We offer an in-house racket stringing service using leading brands of tennis strings aimed at all types of players.

11. Coaching

Our resident Head Pro, James Charman, manages a group of talented, qualified, and accredited coaches who are all DBS certified and trained in first aid and safeguarding. They bring various areas of specialism to the Club to deliver individual and group lessons, programmes and camps to juniors and adults.

Coaches are available midweek 8am to 6pm and at weekends 8am to 8pm. More information can be found on the Club website.

All players who receive individual 1:1 coaching must be members of the Club and only recognised Club coaches are permitted to coach on our courts.

Juniors, Minis and Tots

Under the leadership of our Head Pro, James Charman, the Club offers a comprehensive after-school and weekend Junior Coaching Programme for complete beginners through to performance coaching.

Lessons are split by age groups and emphasize hand-eye ball co-ordination and playing skills. Juniors are also encouraged to take part in competitions at the Club and at other venues. We are an LTA accredited mini-tennis centre and the LTA programme is delivered for Mini Blue, Red, Orange and Green balls, with different levels of Yellow ball programmes.



Competitive Tennis – Inter-Club Box Leagues

Club members can also play competitive tennis through our inter-Club mixed box leagues. Playing in a box league gives you a chance to meet new members and hone your playing skills.


Code of Conduct


